

#### **NEW CAR PARK FOR CMK**


A new multi-storey car park could go a long way towards alleviating the parking problems around Milton Keynes Central station. Milton Keynes Council is progressing the plans for the south side of the station near the ice rink, mirroring the existing multi-storey on the north side. The site is currently used for surface parking and has been earmarked for a multi-storey for many years.

# Thumbs up for New Community Building

CMK Residents supported the latest plans for the proposed new community pavilion in Campbell Park in a consultation run by the Town Council during November and December. Leaflets were distributed to all areas of CMK parish, detailing plans for the new centre, which will include meeting rooms, a performance space and a new public cafe being developed by The Parks Trust.

several from residents involved in local organisations who felt they could make use of the new facilities.

"With the public consultation now complete," said Town Council chair Dr. Rebecca Kurth, "we are now preparing a full planning application for this exciting project, which should be submitted to Milton Keynes Council in the next few weeks." The planning approval process is likely to take several months, but it is hoped the facility will be developed and fitted out for an opening in late 2018.



## **Gallery Expansion Advances**

Construction works are set to begin in early 2017 on Milton Keynes Gallery's expanded building, which will include a bar and cafe, mixed-used auditorium and community facilities. The timescale for the project has been revised as detailed designs have emerged but the scheme is now approaching the point where ground works are ready to begin.

Although parts of the Gallery have to be closed during the expansion works, it will remain active throughout, with its regular 'Start the Art' children's sessions and monthly music nights continuing alongside various other programmes.

"I am delighted that MK Gallery is playing such a significant role in the development of Milton Keynes," said Gallery director Anthony Spira, "by creating a new cultural venue of this scale and quality."





#### Pods go live!

The driverless pods that have been glimpsed on the boulevards of Central Milton Keynes have now entered their 'live' testing period, with Britain's first driverless car test taking place on 5 January. MK-based Catapult Transport Systems is leading the project, spearheading new technologies that could change transport forever.

#### **Rail Link Moves Forward**

Trains may soon be running from Milton Keynes Central to Oxford and Aylesbury after the Chancellor announced £113 million funding for East-West Rail in the Autumn Statement. The new line will link Bletchley to Bicester and Aylesbury, allowing Milton Keynes to gain new services to more distant towns like High Wycombe and Reading.

#### **Inquiry Concludes**

The public inquiry into plans by intu to build over the open space at Midsummer Place ended with three days of cross-examination at the end of November. The Inspector's recommendation to approve or refuse the plans will now be sent to the Secretary of State, who will make the final decision. As soon as we hear the decision, we will inform residents via the website and newsletter.

#### **CMKTC Licensing Work**

One of the Town Council's less known responsibilities involves reviewing all the new licensing applications within the parish. These can range from new pubs and restaurants to casinos and nightclubs. The Town Council carefully considers the impact each application will have on local residents and feeds back comments to Milton Keynes Council, who make the final decision.

## **New Office Block Proposed**



Developers have come forward with plans for a new high-grade office building for the vacant site adjacent to Planet Ice at the former Leisure Plaza, near the station. The proposed building rises to eight stories and will front onto the south side of Avebury Boulevard, filling the current gap between Argos and Planet Ice. As well as office space, the proposals include two retail units, one of which could be a cafe or small restaurant.

The proposals are being developed by AW James,

a Milton Keynes-based commercial property developer, which already operates a large portfolio in the city.

"Our intention is to create a landmark office building of the highest quality," says Andrew Wilson, Managing Director of AW James. "It will be able to attract blue-chip employers whilst also making a major contribution to the ongoing development of Central Milton Keynes."

### MK50 Celebrations Kick Off

The City's 50th anniversary has kicked off in style with a two-week exhibition in Middleton Hall followed by city-wide events for the anniversary weekend on the 23rd of January. However this is just the start of what is expected to be a year packed with events and celebrations of Milton Keynes' half centenary.

A special heritage festival in the spirit of the annual heritage open weekend will take place across the Summer, followed by another outdoor festival in October. ## Parking Changes Debated

For the first time ever Milton Keynes Council is proposing to introduce a £50 annual charge for residents' parking permits and charge visitor permits at £1 a day; this will be decided at a meeting in the Civic Offices on 15 February. If adopted, the charges will affect all residents in CMK or Campbell Park who use Council-issued parking permits to park in public bays near their homes. This does not apply to privately owned parking areas.

CMK Town Council distributed a letter to all affected residents in the parish during the consultation period, which ended on January 31, explaining the plans and encouraging any residents with concerns to contact Milton Keynes Council. That feedback will be heard at a meeting of Milton Keynes Council's Cabinet on February 7 followed by the decision on 15th. Both meetings are open to the public, and any residents who are interested in the proposals are encouraged to attend.


## **Bus Plan Could Help Homeless**

An innovative new proposal to convert a redundant double decker bus into accommodation for homeless people could help improve CMK's worsening situation. The idea comes from a group of local people who were inspired by a similar scheme on the Isle of Wight, where a converted bus provided a safe place to sleep, access to clean food and drink, and a postal address for dozens of homeless people.



The problem in CMK has deteriorated substantially over the last few years, with tents and blankets now a common sight. CMK Warden Rob Harriman has been working hard with different groups to try to resolve the issue, and says he will continue to pressure Milton Keynes Council to do more to solve this pressing issue.

The group, along with the CMK Warden, visited the Isle of Wight recently to see the bus in action. Although there are still a lot of hurdles to overcome, the group are confident the scheme's success can be replicated in CMK.



# Pointing the Way to Go

Many residents will remember the unexpected arrival of a number of new fingerpost signs along Midsummer Boulevard last autumn. CMK Town Council shared the concerns of many residents that the new signs were overly complicated and confusing.

Milton Keynes Council listened to the Town Council's concerns, and we have recently been working with MKC on improving the wayfinding model for CMK, with simplified fingerposts and totem panels laid out to point pedestrians to the major destinations along Midsummer Boulevard.

If the scheme is implemented successfully and is well received, it might be rolled out on the other two boulevards as well.
