Racing and Regulations

The circuit is on closed public roads which have been risk-assessed by the team. There are a number of 90 and 180 degree corners that, within a bunch, may require extra vigilance.

Gear Restrictions

All races are run under the rules and regulations of British Cycling and so all bikes have to be gear-checked according to those regulations before signing-in.

Please ensure your gearing complies with the restrictions, which are there to protect riders and to make racing fair for all.

The gear-checkers will only be checking to see if your bike conforms – they cannot make adjustments for you. If your bike fails, you will have to make the necessary adjustments and then return to the back of the queue. The limits for each race category are published in the British Cycling regulations and can be found on their website.

The top 3 in each race must report to the judges' tent immediately after their race has finished for gear checking and possible drug testing. Do not leave the circuit as this could lead to disqualification.

Sign-on

All bikes have to be gear-checked before sign-on.

A valid racing licence and proof of gear-check (sticker on licence) must be surrendered to the signing-in steward.

As this is a national event, racing licence rules will be strictly enforced. Without a licence you will not be permitted to race. A valid licence is one which has an identifiable picture of the rider on it that is signed and completed with the emergency contact details. Any extenuating circumstances will be subject to the Chief Commissaire's ruling, which will be final.

Race Numbers

You will be provided with two numbers for your race, one to be attached to your jersey on the right of your back and the other to be placed over the right rear pocket, as illustrated below. Spot checks will be made and you may be requested to move numbers to comply with the rules. Failure to comply may result in the judges being unable to place you within the race - any unidentified riders will not be placed.



Fitting your timing chip

We will be using Results Base timing for this event. It is an active timing system and you will be given a chip at sign on which should be fitted to your front fork on the side away from the quick release lever using the zip tie supplied.

You must return the chip when you collect your licence. If you retire early please do not forget to return your chip. Riders who do not return their chips will be subject to a fine.

Your Race

There will be no opportunity to warm-up on the circuit between races but there are course familiarisation sessions on the Event Schedule. Please report to the muster area on Saxon Gate 10 minutes before the start of your race.

All races will be started behind a control vehicle. Please leave a good gap behind the car and do not move alongside or overtake the vehicle.

Championship races will do a full lap behind the control car which will pull away in the finish straight.

Lapped Riders

Rule 20.12.4

A competitor in a road or circuit event when lapped must, unless otherwise instructed by the Chief Commissaire, retire from the race and report to the control point at the finish of the race.

Rule 20.12.5

Where a lapped rider is allowed to continue, he/she shall not give pace or shelter to a rider by whom he/she has been lapped.

Riders who have been 'distanced' from the main pack may be removed from the race **before** they are lapped. Lapped riders finishing in a bunch will all be given the same position, please do not sprint for minor places.

Failure to adhere to these requirements may result in a rider not being placed.

After Your Race

On completion of your race, please leave the circuit at the designated exit point across the carriageway from the finish line, then continue as instructed under the underpass to the warm down area. Do not continue on the circuit for a warm down lap. If you believe you may have been 'in the mix' for a top three position, please report to the judging area. Failure to report immediately after you leave the circuit will result in disqualification.

Public access to the Judges' Area is not permitted, only riders and officials may enter this area.

Only riders and officials may enter the circuit, everyone else must remain behind the barriers.

Rider behaviour

Each rider owes a duty of care to his fellow competitors. Any rider who the Chief Commissaire deems to be riding in a dangerous or compromising manner will be judged accordingly.

The Circuit (see course map)

The course has been extended from previous events at the circuit with a longer fast downhill section before turning through the central reservation to return uphill. The exits are tight and with nowhere to go if you get it wrong other than the barriers. At best your race will effectively be over, if you hit these barriers at worst it could end your season. Do not take risks.

Laps out and Pit Area

Lap outs will not be permitted. The pit area is located on the finish straight on Midsummer Boulevard. A maximum of one helper per rider is permitted in the pit area. Helpers must follow the instructions of the pit steward and race officials. Riders who require the pits must continue on the circuit to the pit area without assistance.

The pit official will adjudicate as to where you can re-join the race.

Results and Prizes

The post-race ceremony will take place at the published presentation times and the first three riders in each race must be present.

Prizes will be presented to the first three girls and first three boys in each race category at the published presentation time for that event, and at no other time. We will endeavour to keep to the published times where possible.

Failure of a rider to appear in person at the presentation will result in any prize money being donated to the running of future youth races in Milton Keynes.


We will aim to publish provisional results prior to the end of the day. These can be found on our event page throughout the day.

Competitor Facilities

The event headquarters will be open for sign-on/registration and gear checking from o8:30.

Registration will be in the Orange Team Milton Keynes Gazebo (see below map). Please be aware that as the central event area is open to the general public, you are responsible for keeping your bike(s) and all other equipment safe and secure at all times.

Warm up area

There is a designated warm-up area that we have put aside for competitors alongside the circuit (Midsummer Boulevard), where riders can prepare for the event on turbo-trainers or rollers, and erect gazebos (if required). Warming up on the circuit will not be permitted.

Riders will be able to familiarise themselves with the circuit during the designated session times only, which start at 09:00 for category C, D and E riders and 11:00 for category A and B riders. However, Course Marshals and Course First Aiders may not necessarily be available during this period.

Toilets


There will be a block of temporary toilets within the central event area, together with facilities at The Church of Christ The Cornerstone (300 Saxon Gate) and the Gear-Change shower/changing block.

Food & Drink

There will be catering outlets in the central event area, as well as many other restaurants, coffee shops, fast-food outlets located close to the circuit in Centre MK and intu shopping centres (Midsummer Boulevard) and The Hub (Avebury Boulevard).

Changing Facilities

Basic changing marquees will be provided within the central event area. A changing room and showers are also available at the Gear-Change facility, which is located just to the west of the course on the corner of Witan Gate, Upper Fourth Street and Midsummer Boulevard (through the underpass). All items left in the changing facilities remain the responsibility of the competitor.

Access to the parking inside the street circuit is off of Silbury Boulevard.

If using Sat Nav please use the postcode MK9 2AJ and follow the directions from the Law Courts to the parking area.

NOTE: Please ensure that you allow sufficient time to park prior to your race in order to register and warm-up.



Alight at Milton Keynes Central railway station. The course is 750m from the station - walk straight up Midsummer Boulevard and follow the event signage.

At the eighth roundabout, take the first exit onto Witan Gate, sign-posted 'Law Courts'.

Take the first turning on your left and follow signs to the event and parking.

Directions from A5

Take the exit sign-posted A509 and Central Milton Keynes.

Take the A509 exit from the elevated roundabout toward Central Milton Keynes (heading north-east). Continue straight over the next roundabout (intersection with V6 Grafton Gate), and at the next roundabout, take the third exit onto Witan Gate.

Take the first turning on your left and follow signs to the event and parking.


Parking Restrictions

Milton Keynes Council will not enforce parking restrictions within the block outlined by the course (C2 in the council map, and shaded in Green on the map above/below/overleaf).

However, there is private parking within this area and these restrictions will still apply. The organisers do not accept liability for incorrectly parked cars and cannot reimburse anyone for any costs incurred. We advise that you carefully check the local parking signage before leaving
